FATHER'S DAY

Father's Day is celebrated on the third Sunday in June in the UK and US, Japan and many countries in Europe.

In many other countries it is celebrated on 19th March which is St. Joseph's day, while other dates chosen include Korea which celebrates it on 8th May.

In Scandanavia it is celebrated on the second sunday in November and in Thailand December 5th is chosen, because it is the King's birthday.

Here are 10 facts and pieces of trivia about Father's Day.

1. Father's Day was invented by American Mrs. Sonora Smart Dodd whose father had, as a single parent raised his 6 children. The first Father's Day was celebrated on June 19, 1910.

2. In spite of the impression you might get from the media, according to the Office of National Statistics, four fifths of children in the UK have a Dad at home - 80 % of dependent children live with their father.

3. Furthermore according to the ONS, 3% of fathers living with dependent children are lone fathers.

4. According to greetings card makers Hallmark, Father's Day is the 5th -largest card-sending holiday of the year.

5. The film Fathers' Day starred Robin Williams and Billy Crystal as 2 middle aged men who are tricked into finding an ex-girlfriends runaway son when she tells them they are both the father. They have to team up to find the boy and discover who the real father is. The film was a hit due to the big-name cast but was not a critical success.



6. Marilyn Monroe famously sung Cole Porter's 'My Heart Belongs to Daddy'. She is reputed to have not known who her real father was.

7. One of the best-know quotes about fathers was from Mark Twain. He said of his Father 'When I was a boy of fourteen, my father was so ignorant I could hardly stand to have the old man around. But when I got to be twenty-one, I was astonished at how much he had learned in seven years.'

8. The episode of Dr. Who (played by Christopher Eccleston) entitled Father's Day involved Rose Tyler (Billie Piper) travelling back in time to the day that her father was killed. She steps in to prevent his death causing the inevitable dent in the space/time continuum.

9. More from the Office of National Statistics; in 1971 the average age of a father where the birth occurred inside a married relationship in England and Wales was 27; by 1999 this had increased to 31. These days, fathers are generally three years younger where births occur outside marriage. The average age of the father where the birth occurred outside marriage decreased from 28 to 26 between 1971 and 1991 but had since increased to almost 28 again in 1999.

10. In China, Father's Day is now celebrated the 3rd Sunday in June, but it used to be the 8th August. The reason is a linguistic one; the Chinese for eight is "ba", while a colloquial word for father is "ba-ba" – therefore the eighth day of the eighth month sounds similar to "papa".

SUMMER 2023 - HOLIDAY ACTIVITIES & FOOD (HAF)



Dear Parent/Carer,

The Department for Education (DfE) funds the Holiday Activities & Food (HAF) programme across the United Kingdom. At it's core, HAF provides young people the opportunity to access enriching activities alongside healthy meals over the **main school holidays at Christmas, Easter & Summer.**

Please note that this programme is entirely separate from the <u>Local Welfare Scheme</u>'s household support funding (i.e. supermarket HUGGG vouchers).

Each eligible young person (in full-time education from Reception to Year 11 who receives benefits-related free school meals) with a HAF code can access a maximum of **16 sessions** over the summer holidays. Families have the flexibility to book with multiple activity providers if desired. All providers can request additional funding for 1-to-1 support if this is required, however this will depend on their staff availability and qualifications. We do have a number of SENDspecific activities which may be a more suitable option.









Eligible families need to request a HAF Code via a brief online form. This can be found at <u>https://searchout.warwickshire.gov.uk/holidays-activities-food-haf</u> or you can scan the QR code below. HAF codes are valid for the academic year, so if you've had a HAF code at Christmas or Easter, the same code can be used. If you need codes to be re-sent, just send us an email via <u>hafprogramme@warwickshire.gov.uk</u>

For families not in receipt of benefits-related free school meals, we can release a limited number of HAF codes for each delivery period. A separate referral form will need to be completed on behalf of your family, if you're facing a significant financial barrier and one (or more) of the following criteria apply:

- · Have an allocated family support worker or social worker
- On an open early help plan
- Your child(ren) acts as a young carer

World Giraffe Day is an exciting annual event initiated by GCF to celebrate the tallest animal on the longest day or night (depending on which hemisphere you live!) of the year – 21 June – every year!
