
New town, new school, but the bully is in Ben's head...

VACCINATION PROGRAMME: 2022/2023

For your information please note **changes** to the school **vaccination programme** for the academic year **2022/2023**:

NHS influenza vaccination Programme:

Secondary school children in Years 7 to 11 will **not** be offered the nasal flu vaccine routinely in school for 2022 to 2023. Those in clinical risk groups will be invited to have a flu vaccination by their GP practice.

• NHS HPV vaccination Programme:

HPV vaccines will now be offered to all pupils in **Years 8 & 9** during the **Spring Term** (Jan – April).

• NHS Doubles vaccination Programme:

Tetanus, diphtheria, polio (Td/IPV) and Men ACWY vaccines will now be offered to all pupils in **Year 9** during the **Summer Term (April – July).**

FREE SUMMER ACTIVITY PROGRAMME AVAILABLE FOR ELIGIBLE WARWICKSHIRE CHILDREN



The Government's Holiday Activities and Food programme (HAF) will be available once again this summer throughout the county, coordinated by Warwickshire County Council (WCC). It is primarily for children aged 4 to 16 in reception to year 11.

The government funded programme enables children and young people nationwide to enjoy fun activities with friends during holiday periods, whilst learning and developing new skills. The Warwickshire HAF programme is launching at the start of the summer holidays and is aimed at those who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals.

There are a variety of local holiday clubs involved, all of which help young people to improve socialisation and learn new things by taking part in enriching activities from sport to music, dance, drama, art, cooking and college workshops, junk modelling, den building, farm animal welfare and much more.

Cllr Jeff Morgan, Portfolio Holder for Children and Families said: "We are really pleased that we can continue with the HAF programme in Warwickshire as we know how much it benefits children families across the county.

"We want children to make the most of the summer holiday by learning new skills, socialising with friends, eating healthy meals and taking part in fun activities, all of which also helps to alleviate some pressure on parents and carers.

"If you're a parent or carer in Warwickshire and you think you might benefit from free holiday clubs then please make sure you find out more about this exciting programme!

Applications are now open to enrol children in a free holiday clubs programme over the summer and places are free for those who are eligible for free school meals. Children will be able to access lots of activities throughout the summer and there are also activities available for children with SEND or additional needs.

Eligible families will have received a HAF booking code via text from Warwickshire County Council. If you think you may be eligible but haven't received a text please email hafprogramme@warwickshire.gov.uk or call the Family Information Service on 01926 742274.

































STARTING AND CHANGING SCHOOLS



CHILDREN CAN EAT FOR JUST £1 AT ASDA CAFÉS

across England and Wales this Summer -

Asda has announced its next move in bids to help feed children this

summer, meaning kids across England and Wales can eat for just £1 at any time of day in Asda Cafés, seven days a week, with no minimum adult spend required.

To help tackle holiday hunger at a time when the cost-of-living is higher than ever, children aged 16 and under can access a hot or cold meal for just £1.

An Asda spokesperson said:

"We know that families can find the summer holidays tough, and our customers are telling us that this year more than ever, they're concerned about holiday hunger. With that in mind, we are so pleased to be able to offer children's meals for just £1, with no minimum adult spend, to ensure that those who would normally rely on a school meal aren't left without."

The Kids Eat for £1 initiative is available all day, every day from **25**th **July until 4**th **September** in England and Wales, as long as the Café is open and dependent on the store, a hot meal or cold meal, or both, will be on offer.

Baby food is also available as part of the initiative, with little ones able to enjoy a free pouch of Ella's Kitchen baby food (70g pouch) in their local Asda Café.

Kids eat free with an adult main meal.

Two children under 16 get a free breakfast with one paying adult every day.

Kids eat for £1 with an adult meal excluding Saturday.




WHEN POET, ASH DICKENSON CAME TO QUEST
