GAME OF THE WEEK

This weeks game is **Articulate!**

This game is about working in a team of 2 against another team of 2 to see who can get round the board the fastest. In a pair the aim is to guess correctly what your partner is describing in 30 seconds. You will roll a dice that tells you where to move to and what you will be describing when you pick a card up. When you guess correctly you move around the board.

What skills does articulate target?

Attention and Listening

Working in a pair requires them to keep focus together on the same target. The players need to remain focused on figuring out what the word is that the other person is explaining. Using their own reasoning skills and methods of deduction to find the target word.

Using language

The player that is describing the target needs to describe in a way that is going to be understood by the other target. Using language that is common between them, this uses processes of verbal reasoning. The game itself has different categories so the players need to use their own knowledge on how they will best describe what they think it is.

Winning and losing

As the players are against a time this teaches them to understand the emotions that go with this. It is down to the players working in their teams to how they will win the game.

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

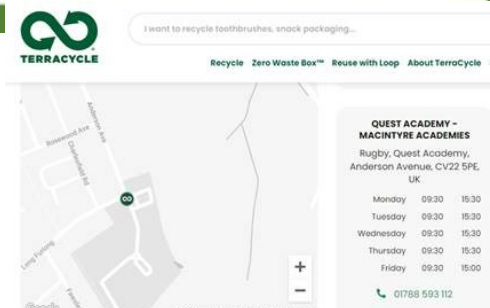

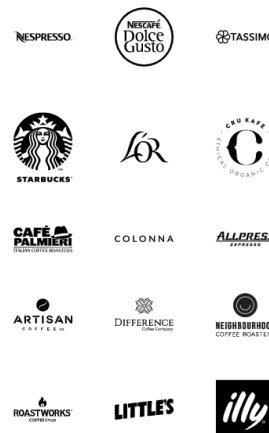

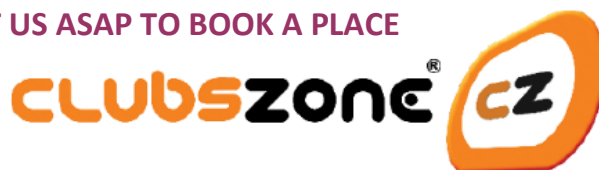

Reporting pupil absence and lateness:
