Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope that you have had a wonderful summer and enjoyed the opportunity to spend more time with family and friends.

Over the summer holiday staff have been working hard to ensure that the new school building is ready for when the pupils come back to school. However, there have been some issues regarding broadband and as a result we may be slower than normal to respond to emails. I am hoping this issue will be resolved by the end of this week.

As you are aware Year 11 pupils received their examination results last Thursday. I am delighted to inform you that the vast majority of the pupils achieved at least six qualifications including GCSE passes in English and Maths. The PE results were particularly good with many of the pupils achieving the equivalent to a level 5/6 GCSE grade.

Now that some of the pupils are able to cycle/walk to school I would like to inform you that the school gates will open at 8.30 am and pupils will be able to go to the canteen or the outdoor playground area.
