QUEST POINTS

The changes in timetable have also resulted in the Quest Points threshold being changed for the whole school. It will now be the following:



UPPER SCHOOL have 7 lessons per day and 5 lessons on Friday. This means they can earn 175 points per week.

- ⇒ **Gold** = 175 165
- \Rightarrow Silver = 164 155
- \Rightarrow Reflection 154 and lower.

This means Upper School have to earn 35 points per day (25 on Friday) for Gold reward time at the end of the day.

LOWER SCHOOL have 6 lessons per day and 5 lessons on Friday. This means they can earn 155 points per week.

- ⇒ **Gold = 155 140**
- \Rightarrow Silver = 139 130
- \Rightarrow Reflection 129 and lower.

This means Lower School have to earn 29 points per day (24 on Friday) for Gold reward time at the end of the day.

As you may already be aware, our delicious school dinners are currently being supplied by an external company, called Educaterers.

Whilst they have been proactive of renegotiating with food suppliers to keep costs down, the recent National Joint Council (NJC) pay increase in labour costs means that school dinner costs will increase slightly in September by 5 pence. This means that with effect from 1^{st} September 2018 a school meal will cost **£2.45** per meal.
