


EAR 9 IMMUNISATIONS

DO THE RIGHT THING

The target is to encourage pupils to make the best choice when faced with a decision.

Facts

Pupils who cannot rely on social understanding to predict and control the behaviour of others might imitate poor behaviour without understanding the inherent complexity or the context in which it occurred

Suggested Script

You need to make the right choice: Walk away and do not get involved

Hints and Tips

Give clear alternatives so that pupils are able to make an informed decision

WE PREFER POLITE

This target is to encourage pupils to improve their use of social language and appropriate manners. This can also be used to calmly discourage the use of bad language/swear words and/or inappropriate tone of voice

Facts

Some pupils are unable to monitor their tone of voice (or volume) and incorrect use can also be interpreted as rude.

Suggested Script

We prefer polite. I am not using bad language. Tell me again using polite words. Your tone of voice made you sound rude. Try again and use a quieter/gentler voice.

Hints and Tips

Do not expect change to occur quickly Ensure that you model the use of polite language with pupils Tell the pupil why it is important to be polite to others

SAFEGUARDING

As part of National #WakeUpWednesday

campaign, The **National Online Safety Team**

have created a quide for schools about Roblox, the online game which is dubbed by its makers as 'the largest interactive social platform for play'.

The guide informs parents about the dangers associated with the platform and how they can reduce the associated risks. including, but not limited to; 'Chatting to Strangers', 'Griefing' and 'Cyberbullying', 'Online Payments' and 'Information Sharing'.



According to the Roblox website, 'Roblox is the world's largest interactive social platform for play.' For those of you not so familiar with the game, it is a multi-player online gaming platform which allows children to play and create a variety of games in a 3D world. Roblox is free to play and available on all modern smartphones, tablets, desktops, Xbox One, Oculus Rift, and HTC Vive.







What parents need to know about

ROBLOX **STUDIO**

The Roblox Studio allows users to create their own games and 'worlds' for others to play on the platform. As the games are user generated, it gives users the freedom to potentially include things you do not want your child to be exposed to, for example, weapons, violence and even pornographic content. There are no age restrictions on the games created in the Roblox Studio and Roblox can only rely on people reporting negative/violent content in order to remove the games order to remove the games from the platform.

CHATTING AND FRIEND REQUESTS

Whilst the games in Roblox are aimed at 8 to 18-year-olds, there are currently no age restrictions for signing up. This means both adults and young people can play and communicate with each other and send friend requests through the platform. Once a friend request is accepted, friend request is accepted, this means that they can communicate with each other outside of gamep

ROBUX ONLINE PAYMENTS

When a user creates a game, they earn omething called 'Robux', which works as a currency within the platform, allowing the purchase of upgrades and memberships. If the created game is of memberships. If the created game is of good quality and attracts multiple players and in-game adverts, children have the potential to earn a lot of 'Robux'. Once a user has earned a certain amount of Robux, they can convert this to real cash and withdraw it to a PayPal account. To withdraw money, users need to be over 13, have a PayPal account and have paid for the Roblox premium subscription.

National Online Safety

UNLIST SOCIAL MEDIA ACCOUNTS

Roblox has a great 2-step verification security feature which we recommend you enable to add an extra layer of security to your child's account.

HAVE A CHAT ABOUT 'GRIEFING'

Griefing is when someone purposely upsets her player in a game. This can be done by setting s, damaging or stealing something from another ayer, intentionally killing them and just generally ng something in the game to spoil gameplay tor n. Essentially. Griefing is a form of cyberbullying

DISABLE IN-GAME CHAT

Robiox is great for children to play together and chat to each other. However, if you wanted to completely turn off in-game chat for your child (meaning they could not contact anyone including their friends) you can do so by following these steps: When logged in, go to the Account Settings page by clicking on the gear icon at the top right corner of the page, then click Settings. Next, click on the Privacy tab and under Who can chat with me in game? select 'No one' and this will disable in-game chat.

RESTRICT PAYMENT METHODS

Robiox is a free to play game, but there are still options to make additional in-game purchases. If you do not want your child to make payments, ensure your card is not associated with their account. If you are happy for your child to make payments in the game, but want to limit spending, we sugges using a games console gift card. These can be purchased in specific amounts, which will allow you to limit how much your child spends and removes the need for a credit/debit card to be used with their account.
