







<p>Spelling Adding my spelling words: Vowels are worth 10 and consonants are 5. Write your words and then add the value of each letter in the word. e.g. cat = 5 + 10 + 5 = 20</p>	<p>Spelling Use an old newspaper or magazine (ask permission first). Find and cut up the letters that make up your 10 most difficult spelling list words. Glue them into your spelling journal.</p>	<p>Spelling Write a rhyming word for each of your spelling words.</p>	<p>Spelling Backwards words: Write your spelling words forwards and then backwards! Remember to write them neatly.</p>	<p>Spelling Write your spelling words using fancy letters. Write the word normally, then write it in a fancy way, e.g. catch catch <i>catch</i></p>									
<p>Maths Roll a die and multiply the number that appears by your first roll to practice your smaller times table.</p>	<p>Maths Choose a number 1-12 and play the card game 'snap'. Every time you 'snap', you need to multiply the number on the card by the number chose at the start. E.g. if you've snapped a pair of 3s, you need to do 2 x 3.</p>	<p>Maths Count the number of teaspoons you have in the kitchen. Multiply this number by 2. Double this number. Multiply this number by 100. Divide this number on half.</p>	<p>Maths How many doors are in your house? Double this number. Add 256 to this number. Add 1000 to this number. Divide this number by 2.</p>	<p>Maths Alphabet numbers: If the letters = 1, b=2, c=3 and so on, how much do the letters in your whole name add to (first name, middle and surname)?</p>

<p>Spelling Look, cover, say, write, check. 10 words from a book your reading or your favourite interest eg Fortnite, Battle box, Skins, Ross.</p>	<p>Spelling Put your spelling words into alphabetical order.</p>	<p>Spelling Draw a picture to match the meaning of each of your words.</p>	<p>Spelling Write silly sentences for your 10 spelling words.</p>	<p>Spelling Write a story or a letter using all of your spelling words.</p>									
<p>Reading Read your favourite book and then write a terrible review about it with reasons why.</p>	<p>Maths Write out all the multiples of each times table onto sticky notes. Practice by looking at each number and saying the table aloud. i.e. 12 is 4 x 3.</p>	<p>Literary Write an introduction to a spooky story. Must include a place character and a reason for being there.</p>	<p>Maths Measure ten things in your house and record the measurements in CM and mm.</p>	<p>Literary Describe one of your meals in 5 sentences.</p>
